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3.2 Questions of Staff

Councillor Saulnier complimented everyone on a great Canada Day at the Town Docks. While there he noticed a light beeping at the nearby pumping station. Mr. Brown said the alarm was a small pumping station taking sewage from the town dock area. The increase volume that day with the people and the rain will tax that station and an alarm will go off. We are looking at upsizing the pumps in that station in the interim and would like to replace it down the road with a bigger station. Staff were there Saturday, Sunday and part of Monday looking into that pumping station as we were having problems with it.

Councillor Keith commented on the new public washrooms. They look really good. She also wanted to know the status of Emily Street? Mr. Brown replied that it is progressing slowly but surely. They are almost at MacFarlane Street. We are having a problem with the active live force main due to it's smaller size and it wasn't located where we thought it would be and of course there's a lot of rock to go through. Councillor Keith also asked about Parry Sound Drive. Will there be another coat of asphalt as she has received some complaints about some rippling on the asphalt. Mr. Brown replied that we've already received an extra thick coat of asphalt and there will be no further applications. He was not aware of any issues of this type and will have it checked out.

Councillor Keith thought the line painting on Cascade and William had just been done and they looked a little worse for wear already. Are we using a different paint? Mr. Brown replied that we've been using the same paint for the last several years. We've had a late start this year due to the incredible amount of rain. As well, the temperature has to be a consistent 20 degrees c+ to make it work and dry properly. He isn't aware of any issue with Cascade and William unless it hasn't been completed yet.

Councillor Borneman asked when we will see bicycle lanes connected along Parry Sound Drive? Mr. Brown replied that the job at hand consists of building a recreation trail from the Pentecostal Church past the YMCA entrance. There is an old road bed there that's just off the road. We are waiting for locates and enough staff to complete it.

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We hope to get to that in the next week or two. Then just past the YMCA at Cedarland Homes on the west side we will go off the road bed onto Parry Sound Drive where we've already paved. There is a three metre wide strip of asphalt to accommodate the recreation trail. We will then continue to where McDougal ran their recreational trail last year and that's where we will connect. We will be adding lines and delineators to ensure the public knows this is a recreation trail and not a place to park or to pass. Hopefully by the end of the month we will have the recreation trail connection that everyone has been waiting for.

5.3 Ken Patel - Canada Best Value Inn & Suites on Joseph Street.

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Mr. Patel expressed his concerns about the Fire Department and their dealings with him regarding smoke alarms in his place of business. He said that they do have a fire alarm system which is tested every year by a professional company and the Fire Department is checking every little thing like batteries in smoke alarms. Last year he paid a \$10,000 fine and this year the Fire Department is checking his building again. Mr. Patel's staff isn't able to replace all batteries that have been removed by occupants. He thinks the fire department is wasting time with all these inspections and time in court and they should be going into the community and educating people. Other towns just charge fines and here in Parry Sound people are taken to court. Mr. Patel says the documentation is wrong and that is why there are delays at court. If this continues he will be out of business and will not be paying taxes. He is looking for some help.

Chief Thompson requested Council's indulgence and asked to say a few things in response to this situation. Mayor McGarvey responded that as long as it doesn't become a debate, he has no issue with that. Mr. Patel has stated his case and clarification from the Fire Chief would be in order.

Chief Thompson said that he would speak in generalities. Smoke alarms save lives. We have had two deaths in the past few years that could have been prevented with working fire alarms. The Fire Department has an active educational program and we go door to door each year here in Parry Sound. And yet when we go on calls, we still find houses and businesses that do not have working smoke alarms. There is zero tolerance for that. We charge everyone when we come across those situations. As far as hotel/motel owners, we starting checking everyone three years ago and this was a direct result of a complaint from a traveling resident. The Fire Prevention officer checked that particular establishment and over 50% of the smoke alarms didn't have batteries. That has been rectified and the Fire Department now checks all the hotel/motel owners in Parry Sound annually. The Fire Prevention officer calls ahead and lets them know a week in advance when he will be by to inspect their building and

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recommends that owners check their alarms and make sure they are working. The Fire Prevention Officer does not want to come in and charge anyone but when business owners are given a heads up a week in advance and the previous issues have not been corrected, the Fire Department has no alternative but to lay charges. Some of our hotel/motel owners are on their second inspection and the problems have still not been dealt with a year later. Obviously, fines will be increased the second time around.

Chief Thompson's final point is that the Fire Code is provincial legislation, not municipal legislation. Council is required to appoint a Fire Chief by by-law and this makes it an apolitical process. This ensures that the rules and the law are applied in a consistent manner and everyone is treated the same.

Lastly, Chief Thompson cited the fire at 19 Parry Sound Road. Charges were laid, we went to court and the owners were convicted and accumulated fines reached \$40,000.00. All due to none working smoke alarms.
